Bills that did not pass:

- 1499-It would have helped to provide behavioral health system responses for individuals with substance use disorder when in crisis
- 1639-It would have created a missing persons clearinghouse including a hotline and alert system
- 1935-It would have provided further definitions as to what constitutes an abusive work environment
- 1939-This bill would have prohibited health carriers from imposing cost sharing for colonoscopies performed following a positive or a non-colonoscopies preventive colorectal cancer screening test
- 5579-This bill would have granted Washington Management System (WMS) employees the right to collectively bargain
