#### **Legislative Update**

- Leg and Policy Subcommittee hosted training earlier this year about the <u>Legislative Process</u> (How a Bill becomes Law)
  - The goal is to bring Laura back to ICSEW to recap the session
  - The subcommittee plans to schedule another training course and will be sending out details around April.

- Additional information:
  - The Leg and Policy role is to educate members about bills that could be of interest. We are not allowed, however, to advocate
  - The legislative process is biennial, and we are in the first biennium: the long session. Sometimes special session occurs to hash out the budget but that is not likely this session
  - Washington State Legislature 2023 Session Cutoff Calendar
  - o Bill Alerts are posted weekly
  - The group completed 14 Bill Alerts. Of those, 7 bills are still alive 5 could be Necessary To Implement the Budget (NTIB) and 3 are dead
  - The 3<sup>rd</sup> house of origin cutoff whittles down the bills, which occurred March 8<sup>th</sup>
  - The next cutoff will be March 29<sup>th</sup>, the remainder of the bills must be heard and passed out of policy committee by this time
  - If a bill has fiscal note aka a financial impact, is considered a "pet project" of a legislator, or listed in budget, it can be deemed NTIB. Some bills indicate that within the bill itself.
